Visa Requirements / Letter of Acceptance	<p>MSF Program Office (or the Chulalongkorn Business School Office of International Affairs) will send a letter of acceptance for visa application to the home university:</p> <p>Trimester System (Year 2014 onward)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • by June 30 for Term 1 • by October 31 for Term 2 • by February 26 for Term 3 <p>Students should apply for a non-immigrant “ED” type visa at the Thai Embassy or Consulate. A multiple re-entry visa is recommended to get before arrival for those who plan to leave the country during the exchange semester.</p> <p>Note: All students will be allowed to stay for 90 days for the first entry with student visa. They should get their visa extended before the last day to stay until the end of the semester. Students can request a visa extension letter from the Master of Science in Finance Program Office.</p>																											
Orientation Session	Master of Science in Program Office will arrange orientation session for exchange students for free of charge. Orientation session will be normally arranged on the first day of the academic term																											
Recommended Arrival Date	We recommend students arrive a few days before the start of the academic term. Students should inform the Master of Science in Finance Program Office as soon as they get plane ticket or arrival information.																											
Health Insurance	Students are suggested to have appropriate insurance coverage while living in Thailand.
